Types of Credits and General Distribution:

One ECTS credit corresponds to 25 hours of student workload, taking into account attended work (going to lectures) and independent study (outside class time).

The 240 credits (6,000 hours) are spread over four years and worth 60 credits each (1,500 hours per year). In turn, they are split across two semesters (semester one: September-February; semester two: February-June), with each allocated 30 credits (750 hours).

The ECTS workload hours have been proportionally spread across weeks in the academic years meaning the average amount of weekly student work hours is 40 (for full-time students; students may also register part-time).

Core training subjects (blue and green: those in green are common to all Health Sciences) and mandatory training subjects (grey) are worth six ECTS credits each (150 hours). Electives are worth three credits each (75 hours).

* External placements and final degree projects are second-semester subjects. Nonetheless, the selection/allocation of placements and project topics are undertaken in the first semester. This means students may do their placements in semester one and start their final degree project before the second semester.
