

**ACCREDITATION CRITERIA FOR 90 HEALTH CREDITS FOR THE
DEGREES IN PSYCHOLOGY FROM THE UNIVERSITY OF THE
BALEARIC ISLANDS IN ORDER TO ACCESS
THE MASTER'S PROGRAMME IN GENERAL HEALTH PSYCHOLOGY**

In accordance with Order ECD/1070/2013 of 12th June, the Faculty of Psychology at the University of the Balearic Islands has established the following subjects as health subjects on the official degree programmes in Psychology (1997 and new syllabus), both to be considered when accrediting a pass mark in the 90 health credits required before taking the official Master's in General Health Psychology and for accrediting all health credits taken:

Solely in line with applying the b.1 criterion: core and mandatory subjects (and, therefore, taken by all students) linked to the area of Personality, Psychological Evaluation and Treatment, and Psychobiology, count for 62 credits and, therefore, it would be necessary to take a total of 28 credits to reach the minimum 90-health credit requirement from the subjects in the criteria tables b.2 and b.3.

It should be highlighted that graduates who have taken the specialisation pathway in Clinical and Health Psychology will have a minimum of 104.5 health credits and, therefore, are able to accredit the required 90 ECTS credits.

c) Degrees with pre-1997 syllabi.

In order to calculate the health credits, the adaptation tables will be used retrospectively, for example, for the programme with the 1994 or 1997 curricula, or earlier.

These criteria shall be used to issue a specific document at the Faculty of Psychology signed by the Dean of the Faculty of Psychology, upon request of those interested parties. It shall state, where applicable, fulfilment of the requirement of having taken at least 90 health credits and the total health credits taken with the subjects corresponding to either of the official degree programmes in psychology at the UIB (former and current syllabus).
